Bunscoil McAuley Rice School Uniform Policy

A school uniform makes all students equal and helps to give them a sense of identity with the school. It climinates competition in dress and helps to foster a good learning environment. All students are expected to be in the school uniform every day and when representing the school.

Parents/Guardians are asked to co-operate with the school authorities in this regard. Good order and security considerations demand that the policy on uniform be strictly enforced.

School Uniform(available in O'Brien's Drapery, Callan):

Our school uniform consists of a crested school tracksuit and crested polo shirt, a crested school coat and school shorts for warmer weather. School shorts will be allowed in September/October and May/June.

- Only the school jacket (crested) may be worn in the school.
- Simple jewellery is allowed. Simple stud earrings are allowed. Drop earrings are not allowed. Multiple carrings/studs are not allowed. The school reserves the right to designate the jewellery to be worn.
- For health and safety reasons, large hoop earrings are not allowed for any student. Only in the event of an accident or illness or emergency at school will a student be given the loan of a uniform for the day size and condition cannot be guaranteed.
- Parents will be notified when there is a no-uniform day.
- Students who arrive out of school uniform will be in breach of the code of behaviour.
- The following sanctions will apply:
- a) Reasoning with the child
- b) Reprimand
- c) Temporary separation from peers, friends and others
- d) Loss of privileges
- e) Prescribing additional work
- () Communication with parents
- g) Referral to Principal
- h) The Principal may request that the parents/guardians take the student home early from school.
- i) Suspension (temporary)

(The above list of reprimands does not have to be followed in order.)

Summary Feedback from Parents/ Guardians re: School Uniform Policy 21st April 2023:

- i. Summary of Parent/ Guardian comments regarding current formal uniform and tracksuits:
 - Kids prefer the tracksuit for comfort.
 - My girls enjoy wearing the tracksuit but find the uniform uncomfortable. The cardigan/jumper itches them.
 - Would prefer just tracksuit as not many kids wearing the uniform.
 - Tracksuit preferred.
 - Tracksuit bottoms are too baggy.
 - Bottom of tracksuit poor quality material.
 - Prefer only the tracksuit but the tracksuit itself is outdated and in need of modernization.
 - Tracksuit and sports jacket would be more practical as my son has sport of some form every day.
 - My daughter hates the skirt and jumper. Tracksuit only should be an option for all classes and not just younger.
 - On Uniforms days there's no alternative to trousers- my son is a very warm child that suffer from eczema and the trousers makes it worse every time he has to wear it.
 - Bad fitting, too baggy in shape and poor quality material, I would suggest a more fitted style.
 - I like the tracksuit and shorts; they are practical for both girls and boys.
 - The uniform jumper is very scratchy.
 - No use for uniform kids more comfortable in tracksuits but needs updating.
 - No shorts at all. It's too cold for them most of the year. As well some kids wear them too early- should be banned until 1st of May.
 - Formal uniform is rarely worn so seems a waste of money
